This unit can be taken towards a wide variety of undergraduate and postgraduate courses. It is recognised by the Melbourne College of Divinity (MCD), the Australian College of Theology (ACT), the Sydney College of Divinity (SCD) and the Victorian government (for Tabor College and Harvest). By negotiation it will probably count towards degrees with other colleges and universities.
